3. WHO IT HELPS (150 WORDS)

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Specific, named beneficiaries. Avoid generalities like "young people" — be concrete.

4. EVIDENCE (250 WORDS)

4. Evidence (250 words)

Anything you've tested, made, prototyped, surveyed or measured. Screenshots and links welcome (count against word limit if pasted in).

5. WHY NOW (100 WORDS)

5. Why now (100 words)

What changed in the world that makes this possible or urgent today.

6. WHAT'S NEXT (200 WORDS)

6. What's next (200 words)

What you'd do with mentorship, funding or sponsor introductions. Six-month and 12-month plan.

7. THE TEAM (150 WORDS)

7. The team (150 words)

Each team member's role and one line on why you. Include any teachers or mentors who helped.

8. AI USE DISCLOSURE (100 WORDS)

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Be specific about what AI tools you used and how. Honest disclosure does not disadvantage your entry — undisclosed AI misuse does.

9. SOURCES (100 WORDS)

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Any data, research or third-party content you cite. Links acceptable.
